Fox River Trail Repaving: Short-Term Pain for Long-Term Gain

Our beloved **Fox River Trail** is about to get a much-needed facelift this summer, which means trail enthusiasts will need to temporarily trade their running shoes for patience as six miles between **Portlier Street and Heritage Road** undergo comprehensive resurfacing. Like our infamous "orange barrel season" on roadways, this project comes with its share of detours and dusty disappointments, but the temporary inconvenience promises years of smooth sailing—or rather, smooth cycling. While dodging construction equipment might not be the outdoor adventure you signed up for this summer, the enhanced safety and improved usability will benefit the region's growing population of cyclists, joggers, and leisurely strollers for years to come. The trail's transformation from bumpy to beautiful ensures this cherished corridor remains the crown jewel of Green Bay, Allouez and De Pere's recreational infrastructure.
